CREDIT RECOVERY

A student who fails to earn credit for a required course must acquire the credit in an approved summer school in order to return to St. Thomas the following year. No credit will be recognized for courses taken in the summer unless they have been previously approved by the Assistant Principal. The only exception to this is in full-year math and foreign language courses in which what is learned second semester builds on what is learned first semester. In this case, the first semester failing grade will be raised to 70 if the student earns a semester grade of 75 or better for the second semester. (Exceptions: Pre-Calculus and Advanced Pre-Calculus).

All students are expected to develop and maintain good study habits. Students will strive to pass all courses. A student who fails more than one subject in a quarter will be ineligible to participate in any extra-curricular activities until the next report card.

A student must have been in attendance at St. Thomas for at least five consecutive semesters in order to be declared Valedictorian or Salutatorian.
