Boston University Trustee Scholarship Competition –prestigious merit-based award recognizes students who show outstanding academic and leadership abilities. Many of their current Scholars had perfect 4.0 grade point averages in high school and typically ranked in the top 5–10% of their class. In addition, Trustee Scholars are intellectually and creatively adventurous and demonstrate viewpoints, experiences or achievements beyond the usual. They are, in other words, not just top students, but extraordinary people.

The APIASF General Scholarship - is open to Asian American and Pacific Islander high school and college students who will be enrolling or are currently enrolled in a U.S. accredited college or university as a degree-seeking undergraduate student in the upcoming academic year. There are multiple scholarship opportunities that vary in award amount, number of years, field of study, location, and more.

Washington Crossing Foundation Scholarship - awards \$500 to \$5,000 for students planning careers in government service, for study at the college of the recipient's choice. All awards are for one year.

The Mensa Education & Research Foundation college scholarship - program bases its awards totally on essays written by the applicants. Consideration is not given to grades, academic program or financial need.

RMHC U.S. SCHOLARSHIPS - offer scholarships to students in financial need who have demonstrated academic achievement, leadership and community involvement. Since 1985, more than \$56 million in scholarships have been awarded. Graduating high school seniors may only apply for *one* of the four scholarships. **The deadline to apply is January 18, 2018 at 11:59 PM Central Time Zone and all mailed back-up documents must be postmarked by the same date. Texas Engineering Foundation – will award scholarships to students studying to become engineers in an engineering program at an ABET-Accredited college or university. **Applications are available in Ms. Rawls office 2220 and are due January 19, 2018.**

The Coolidge Scholarship - is an annually awarded, full-ride, presidential scholarship that covers a student's tuition, room, board, and expenses for four years of undergraduate study. This one-of-a-kind scholarship may be used at *any* accredited college or university in the U.S. Note: only current high school juniors (i.e. students who intend to enroll in college full-time for the first time in fall of 2019) are eligible to apply.

Texas Student Housing – this scholarship is open to students accepted to colleges in Austin, College Station, or Denton, Texas that have not signed off-campus housing leases.

Applications are available in Ms. Rawls office 2220 and the application deadline is January 31, 2018.

Carr P. Collins Scholarship - Baylor awards several scholarships to incoming freshmen who demonstrate leadership through service. Recipients are awarded a minimum of \$5,200 their freshman year, renewable for three additional years. **For consideration, applicants must:**

- rank in the top quarter of their graduating class
- have a minimum score of 1250/1310 (old/new) on the SAT or 28 on the ACT
- have completed a balanced college preparatory program including history, science and a foreign language
- be a bona fide resident of the state of Texas

Princeton Prize in Race Relations Scholarship – recognizes high school students who help improve race relations in their schools or communities. Students win \$1,000.00 and an all-expenses paid trip to Princeton University to attend the Princeton Prize Symposium on Race. **Apply online at pprize.princeton.edu by January 31, 2018.**

Jackie Robinson Foundation – application is the vehicle through which more than 4,000 talented young minority high school students apply to become JRF scholars and carry on the civic-minded legacy of the Foundation's namesake, Jackie Robinson.

Jackie Robinson Foundation Scholarship, an applicant must:

- Be a graduating, minority high school senior
- Plan to attend an accredited and approved four-year institution within the United States
- Show leadership potential
- Demonstrate a dedication to community service
- Present evidence of financial need
- Be a United States citizen
- Have a minimum SAT score of 1,000 combined on the math and critical reading sections or a composite ACT score of 21
- Not possess a degree from a 2 or 4-year college when applying for the scholarship

The deadline to submit the application for a Jackie Robinson Foundation Scholarship is February 1, 2018 5:00 pm E.T.

BAYLOR 2018 Natural Disaster Relief Scholarship - As a small way to help, Baylor has launched a new scholarship, valued at up to \$7,500, for students who were directly impacted by a natural disaster this year. Please fill out form at the link below **as soon as possible** to see if you're eligible. If you are accepted to Baylor, your scholarship will be reviewed for eligibility and a representative from the financial aid will follow up with you upon your acceptance. **Funds will be distributed on a first come, first served basis, and this offer will close on February 1, 2018.**

As a reminder, Baylor's application is free and their Early Action deadline is November 1. However, if you are needing an extension, please reach out to your Admissions Counselor and they will work with you individually.

National Co-Op Scholarship program – encourages students interested in science, mathematics, engineering and technology to apply for this merit co-op scholarship. To qualify for this scholarship, students must have a minimum 3.5 GPA, apply for the 2018-2019 academic year to one of the WACE Partner institutions, complete the National co-op scholarship application, and include a typed one-page essay (200 words) describing why you have chosen to pursue a college cooperative education program.

Linda Lorelle Scholarships- are awarded annually to high school juniors attending any public, private, or charter school in Harris or Fort Bend County – plus juniors participating in: Kickstart, Boys & Girls County, Boys & Girls Harbor, and Chinquapin Preparatory School. Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 (on a 4.0 scale), be eligible for federal aid, display valid financial need, and the ability to overcome unusual circumstances.

George and Mary Hamman Foundation Scholarship - Each Spring, the Foundation awards seventy (70) scholarships to Houston area high school seniors for undergraduate study. ELIGIBILITY:

- Students who are citizens of the United States. Students with Permanent Resident status are not eligible.
- The Scholarships are awarded based on academics and financial need.

WHO QUALIFIES TO APPLY?

- Intend to enroll as a full-time student in an accredited college, vocational or technical school in the Summer or Fall of 2018
- Minimum GPA of 2.75
- Minimum of 30 documented service or volunteer hours
