Scholarships and Awards – January 2019

The Terry Foundation Scholarship - is awarded to Texas high school seniors who have been accepted for admission to one of the Terry-affiliated public universities in Texas. The Terry Scholarship is intended to provide scholarships up to the cost of attendance to outstanding students. Other scholarships or aid and family household contribution will be considered when determining the Terry scholarship stipend. Please contact each **individual school** for specific instructions. **Please view the deadlines below for each Terry-affiliated school. In addition, you must complete the FAFSA application in order to be consider for the scholarship.**

GOTRANSCRIPT ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM - awards scholarships year-round to high school seniors who plan on attending a four-year university.

Scholarship Essay's Prompt:

Briefly talk about yourself and your academic/career short-term and long-term goals. Then, answer the following questions:

1. What have you learned from your experience(s)? Examples may include: community service, volunteer work, employment, school clubs, sports, family, etc.
2. Describe your most meaningful achievements and how they relate to your field of study and your future goals.
3. Write 500 to 1,000-word essay on the following topic: Share a story about how language has helped you express your voice.

The APIASF General Scholarship - is open to Asian American and Pacific Islander high school and college students who will be enrolling or are currently enrolled in a U.S. accredited college or university as a degree-seeking undergraduate student in the upcoming academic year. There are multiple scholarship opportunities that vary in award amount, number of years, field of study, location, and more.

Deadline to apply is January 11, 2019 at 5:00 PM EST; Apply online at http://www.apiasf.org/scholarship_apiasf.html.

Washington Crossing Foundation Scholarship - awards \$500 to \$5,000 for students planning careers in government service, for study at the college of the recipient's choice. All awards are for one year.

Applications will be accepted only at P. O. Box 503, Levittown, PA 19058-0503 as indicated in the instructions. Please note that scholarship applications are to be POSTMARKED by January 15, 2019. Apply online at www.gwcf.org.

Architects Foundation Diversity Advancement Scholarship - This multi-year scholarship supports high school and undergraduate minority students who are entering, enrolled in, or transferring into a NAAB-accredited undergraduate architecture program. Scholarships may be renewed every year until your degree is completed, for up to 5 years (\$20,000 total award).

All applications must be submitted via online portal; see website for details.

DECA Scholarship Awards - scholarship program provides over \$300,000 in scholarships at the International Career Development Conference (ICDC) each year. Many corporate partners of DECA provide scholarships through the DECA Scholarship Program. DECA Inc. administers the program based on guidelines set by the donor. Must be a current national member of DECA.

Coolidge Scholarship - is a full-ride, four-year, merit scholarship that may be used by recipients for undergraduate study at any accredited college or university in the United States. Any high school junior who plans on enrolling in college in the fall of 2020 and is an American citizen or legal permanent resident is eligible to apply (unfortunately current high school seniors are not eligible to apply). Coolidge Scholars are selected based primarily on academic excellence. Secondary criteria include: an interest in public policy, an appreciation for and understanding of the values President Coolidge championed, as well as humility and service.

Deadline to apply is January 23, 2019; apply online at www.coolidgescholars.org.

Redfin - is offering a \$2,500 Scholarship to two students each year. Winners are chosen by submitting a winning essay, which in 300-500 words best answers the question posted on the website regarding the real estate industry. The actual essay topic may change for each application period. Eligibility is open to legal U.S. residents, 18 years of age or older, who are graduating high school seniors or to current college students, with a GPA of at least 3.5. Complete entry details can be found by visiting the Redfin website listed above.

Union Plus Education Foundation Scholarship - Current and retired members of unions affiliated with the AFL-CIO, participating in any Union Plus program, their spouses and their dependent children (as defined by IRS regulations) can apply for a Union Plus Scholarship. Participating union members from Puerto Rico, Canada, Guam and Virgin Islands and U.S. citizens are eligible. Members do not have to purchase any Union Plus program product or participate in any Union Plus programs to apply for the scholarship, and scholarship awards are not based upon participation in a Union Plus program.

Scholarship award amounts range from \$500 to \$4,000. This is a one-time cash award for study beginning in the fall of the same year.

The individual must be accepted into a United States accredited college or university, community college or recognized technical or trade school at the time the award is issued. Undergraduate and Graduate students are eligible.

Applicants for scholarships are evaluated according to academic ability, social awareness, financial need and knowledge of labor and union issues, as it relates to the applicant and/or their family.

Texas Student Housing – this scholarship is open to students accepted to colleges in Austin, College Station, or Denton, Texas that have not signed off-campus housing leases.

Applications are available in Ms. Rawls office 2220 and the application deadline is January 31, 2019.

The Carr P. Collins Scholars Program - was established to recognize and reward students who have demonstrated leadership through service.

Application requirements:

1. Completed scholarship application (below)
2. Resume of your high school honors, awards, achievements, extracurricular activities and community service
3. **Handwritten** essay of no more than 500 words illustrating your concept of leadership and how your community service experiences have impacted your life
4. Nomination for the Carr P. Collins Scholars Program from a teacher, counselor or principal that includes a brief explanation of why you deserve the scholarship

The Student-Caregiver Scholarship - provides financial assistance to students who are caring for an adult relative while enrolled in college. Two scholarships of \$1,500 are awarded each year to student-caregivers to help cover costs of tuition and books. Applicants must be full-time college students at an accredited two-or-four-year college or university in the United States, or full-time high school students who are registered to attend a qualifying institution the following semester.

Lawrence Technological University’s Scholarship Competition – apply to Lawrence Tech for the Fall 2019 semester at www.ltu.edu/apply. Write a 500-word response to the following topic and submit your essay online at www.ltu.edu/scholarshipcompetition by February 1, 2019. Please include your name, phone number, and intended major on your essay.

INNOVATION is a hallmark of a Lawrence Technological University education. Choose a person whose innovations have inspired you. Explain why that person was successful and how his or her innovation is helpful to society. What characteristics of the innovator would you like to incorporate into your own life?

Diversity Scholars Program - can be used to cover educational related expenses including tuition, fees and housing. Each student will receive \$5,000 per year for a maximum of eight semesters of study. In this scholarship program students receive more than just a financial award. Diversity Scholars also receive academic support from program staff to assist them in successfully transitioning to UT Dallas through academic check-ins, workshops and various leadership & conference opportunities.

We the students Essay Contest - the Bill of Rights Institute will conduct an essay contest in focusing on the principles of the Constitution and their relevance today. To enter, eligible students must log on to the essay website and submit an entry that follows the Submission Guidelines as detailed in Section III. The Bill of Rights Institution is asking students to personalize their essays while encouraging them to expand their understanding of citizenship beyond an abstract concept, envisioning it as knowledge and actions inspired by America’s founding principles. The specific essay prompt this year is: “What are essential qualities of a citizen in your community in 21st century America?”

Dana Michelle Pettaway Servant's Heart Scholarship - seeks to identify Christian high school seniors who exhibit leadership in areas of volunteerism and community service, while maintaining high academics. The DMP Scholarship will award 7 students who possess the above qualities and who plan to attend an institution of higher learning.

Applications are available in the counseling center and must be postmarked by March 19, 2019.

The Texas Italian –American Sports Foundation Scholarship – awards scholarships to deserving college student athletes, who participate in a school-sanctioned sport, makes passing grades, and have a financial need. Students are eligible for four years, providing they continue to meet the scholarship criteria.
