## **Luminare Screening**

Beginning Monday, August 10th, all St. Thomas visitors, students, teachers, and staff will be required to successfully complete the Luminare Quickscreen system before coming onto campus. By self-screening each day before entering the school, we all can be a part of the solution to protect ourselves, fellow students, staff and families. For students, we strongly encourage a parent/guardian go through the online brief questionnaire with your son each day. Students must stay home if they feel sick and the screening process can help filter and assist with this decision.
