Implementation of QuickScreen COVID-19 Student Screening Tool


All students will be required to self-screen on all school days beginning Thursday, September 10th, for COVID-19 symptoms as a precautionary measure to reduce the spread of COVID-19 within the campus community. *As we begin hybrid classes all students, whether joining remotely or in person, must do the screening in the morning before the school day begins.*

We ask every parent/guardian to make sure their student does the self-screening *before leaving home* and coming to campus through the QuickScreen tool. The link to QuickScreen for students is: <https://checkforcorona.com/sths-students>.

- The screening takes less than a minute
- Make sure you put your student's first and last name (not the parent's) and your student's school ID number. You will find it in your STH portal. It must be his correct ID number for the system to properly compile the needed data. You can click "remember me" so you will not have to remember this information each time you log in.
- After answering the brief questionnaire, students will see a green, yellow, or red screen with instructions for how to proceed
- The answers to the student assessment questions will be documented and confidentially maintained

GREEN screening result – the student is cleared to come to campus as usual

YELLOW screening result – the student should stay home until parent/guardian has spoken with the Dean of Students Office to clear or not clear the student to come to campus

RED screening result – the student should stay home and self-quarantine. The student/parent should monitor his symptoms and call a doctor or use telemedicine services if concerned about their symptoms. The parent should contact the Dean of Students Office for more information.

A student may return to campus when:

- He has had no fever for at least three (3) days without taking medication to reduce fever during that time; AND
- Any COVID-19 symptoms have greatly improved; AND
- At least 10 days have passed since the symptoms began
- Any individual with symptoms who is not evaluated by a medical professional or tested for Covid-19 is assumed to have the virus and cannot return until the above three conditions are met. Any individual with symptoms who wants to return before the above stay-at-home period must present a note from a medical professional confirming an alternate diagnosis, or receive two separate confirmations at least twenty-four hours apart indicating they are free of Covid-19 via acute infection tests at an approved site or by their medical professional. PCR tests are preferred; a negative result for an antigen test requires a PCR test confirmation.

This must be cleared through the Dean of Students Office before the student comes back on campus.

Students must also use this screening tool on non-school days if coming to campus for meetings, athletic practices, games, etc.
