- Steve Green and family honored at the Gala. They were very grateful to come together.
- Playoff football is gearing up. Celebrating our State Champion Cross Country team.
- The Fall Drama Production, Wyrd Sisters was a wonderful celebration in October. Truly grateful for the connections to our sister schools.
- Bishop Italo Dell'Oro speaking at the Father Son Mass was another wonderful celebration with fathers and sons. Looking forward to Mother Son Mass in December.
- Newest Melodies with Murphy is coming up.
- o STH Open House is coming up in December—a seminal event in our community.

# III. Guest Speaker

Mike Netzel, Athletic Director

- Planning daughter's wedding next Saturday.
- Our facilities expanding with the new campus acquisition—New baseball park is the obvious part. Cavan Biggio '13 said it was as nice as any ballpark he played on in college and even some minor league ballparks too. Father Wilson has been represented well. Meat and potatoes of the new facility is the training facility, new weight room, wrestling room, gym, etc.
- Now other sports--lacrosse, soccer, rugby--are able to use the previous Father Wilson field practice field. A good adjacent field to the Student Center and courtyard for the boys to run around and we can keep an eye on them.
- Eagle Project coming up for an STH student--taking down the previous baseball stands/bleachers and press box and make the space an inviting area with picnic tables.
- You can rest assured that the school is spending the money we have in the places to give your boys the best possible experience while they are here at STH.
- Update on our Sports Programs—This year has been the single best year in the 16 years I've been here with more boys than ever trying out for all sports. (170 boys in the football program; 50 boys in Cross Country program; Basketball had 75 boys try out for 45 spots; 90 boys tried out for soccer for 40+ spots; 30+ boys are in the swimming program; wrestling program has 50 boys outfitting every weight class with 3 guys for each class. We are building programs, not teams. We care about the boys Freshman year all the way up.
- Won our first Cross Country State Championship since 2004. Much pride and joy in the boys and Coach Labus.
- o Undefeated football season 10-0—3<sup>rd</sup> since history of the school. Last one was 2013.

- Our last win was most impressive win since Netzel has been here--the way our seniors rallied around the Freshman QB after Donte was hurt. First 2 playoff games are here on campus. Need to win the first one to proceed.
- o Winter sports are off to a great start. Soccer is very talented group.
- Swim team finished 3<sup>rd</sup> out of 25 schools, only private school there. First meet.
- o Coach Llorens' basketball teams won their first tournament. He is a perfect fit for STH!
- Wrestling program is starting off. We are hosting some meets at STH this year.

# IV. Principal's Report

Dr. Aaron Dominguez '96

- Appreciate our level of excellence in Athletic Department and all Departments. Some more examples--
- Our students are serving at Loaves and Fishes, this week carving turkeys and providing a Thanksgiving mean; Campus Ministry team has revamped our Retreat Program and ministry here; Our Academic Program has more AP courses and over the last five years we have increased the number of students taking them and the percentage of students earning college credit for AP exams has increased. Last week we were named a Platinum Honor Roll School by the College Board for our performance on the AP assessments.
- Our Deans office is striving towards a restorative approach rather than suspensions/punishment. The focus is on how to restore the relationship when a wrong has been done to another student, not how do we punish them. Justice for us is about restoration.
- It is more difficult when there has been a violation of human dignity—racial slur, making fun of someone for the academic ability...We are working on a program in the Campus Ministry that we ask the students to go through that is meant to educate and support the student and ultimately restore the relationship with the other person. (Dr. D shared other examples of violations of human dignity after this was asked by a mom.)
- Max Holmes' Admissions events are all filling up. All metrics are pointing to another full class for next year.
- One point to remind the boys—in the interest of safety and security and putting measures into place—this place is not their playground. They come here to learn under the direct supervision of staff and faculty. Our facilities have access but need to be under the supervision of someone who works here. Badges must be worn. Police officers will be asking for badges and if someone doesn't have a badge, they will be escorted off campus. Trepass violations will be issued after the second violation without a badge. This is a safety issue in regards to a litigious standpoint and also a health and wellness standpoint.
