III. Guest Speaker

Joe O'Brien, Director of Student Life

- Phone-a-thon for Round Up kicked off last night. Joe coordinates the Phone-a-thon and letter
 writing campaign. For the guys who may not have connections, this is a good way to participate.
 They sign up and come one evening during the week. They can also check with him at 3:00 daily to
 see if any phones are available for use. There are benefits to selling 5 quotas so this is a good way
 to participate.
- o Stay dialed in to the spirit of RU; this is not a competition.
- o Calling all next week until names run out. Alumni are called and then Tom's Moms.
- Letters go to contacts we cannot contact by phone.
- Prom is going to be at Minute Maid Park in the big ballroom and atrium that overlooks the field.
 Friday, April 5, 8-11 p.m. (8:30-10:30 Lock-in) Cost is about \$140-\$150/couple. Hosting with Duchesne.
- Now using Mobile Serve for service hours. Easier for the boys to document what they've done. Can simply send a picture to verify their participation. To document or see past year's service, make sure to pull down and get the year.

IV. Principal's Report

Dr. Aaron Dominguez '96

- RU Season—Round Up is a 100% student led, collected, executed fundraiser. All the proceeds go to financial assistance and scholarships to students at STH. We give approximately 2.8 million dollars of scholarship money/year.
- Loss of Mr. Melchor may hit people at different times and different ways. Supports are in place for the boys--Wellness Counselor, Marisa Gonzales and also Father Murphy. Thank you to the community for reaching out to the family with food and gift cards, support, and prayers.

- We are in the business of providing a service to the community. We have 2 new teachers starting this Spring. Martin Sanchez for Math; Sally Flores for Spanish.
- Survey was sent for us to rank how likely we are to recommend St. Thomas to a colleague or friend. Data will be shared in the Spring. (450 responses. 80% were promoters with wonderful comments.) Appreciate those who left their name on the positive side. May have some focus groups in the Spring to see how we can multiply the positive.
- o Admissions season is upon us.
- o Prospective Athlete Night tomorrow. House points to boys who come to the basketball game.
- Admissions numbers are slightly ahead of this time last year.
- First and foremost an academic institution. (230 observations of our teachers, students logged 2600 visits to specialists, 260 referrals submitted for students from faculty to get needs met)
- For the Fall semester this year--all grade levels and courses--51% A's, 38% B's, 7% C's, 3.5% D-F. Testifies to teachers and achievement of students, and supportive parents.
